COMPETITIVENESS COUNCIL COSTS

In reply to **Mr HAMILTON-SMITH**.

The Hon. M.D. RANN: The Minister Assisting the Minister for Industry and Trade has provided the following information:

There are no costs associated with the establishment of the Competitiveness Council. The Economic Development Board members of the Competitiveness Council do not receive any remuneration for their work on the Council. A Competitiveness Council secretariat has been established within the Office of the Economic Development Board to support the Council and this comprises four FTEs. The positions were reallocated from within the Department of Trade and Economic Development and no new positions have been created to support the Council.

HISTORY TRUST AND SA MUSEUM REVENUE

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE**.

The Hon. M.D. RANN: I have been advised of the following:

This is predominately a timing and accounting process issue. With regard to the History Trust, at the time the income was estimated it reflected lower than expected visitor numbers at the National Motor Museum. Subsequent to the budget being provided, attendance figures improved markedly. The History Trust have now revised their estimated revenue to \$1.003 million, an increase from 2006-07.

During 2006-07, the South Australian Museum made a change in its commercial activities whereby both the shop and café operations were transferred, effective 1 November 2006, from the Museum Board to the Museum Foundation. Arising from this is an estimated \$550 000 revenue that will no longer appear within the Arts SA administered accounts. However the Museum's projected ongoing success in achieving Australian Research Council grants, plus the impost of charges to temporary exhibitions is expected to appreciably meet this shortfall. As a result the forward external revenue projections show a 4 per cent decline for 2007-08. However, it should be noted this decline is essentially an accounting/reporting matter in that the revenue forgone through Arts SA is effectively still accrued for the benefit of the Museum through the Foundation.

With regard to boosting visitor numbers, the honourable member would be aware that both the History Trust and Museum are included in South Australia's Strategic Plan target 4.3 to increase visitor numbers at cultural institutions by 20 per cent by 2014. I am happy to report that the Museum achieved record attendance every month but May for the last 6 months of the financial year in 2006-07.

Both organisations are involved in a number of initiatives as part of South Australia's Strategic Plan such as continuous improvements to the amenities of galleries and public spaces like renovating the Migration Museum at the History Trust and creating a new Biodiversity Gallery at the Museum; providing high profile special exhibitions; developing partnerships and collaborations such as History Trust's recent work with the State Electoral Office; and targeting initiatives at young audiences.

PUBLIC SERVANTS CAP

In reply to **Mr HAMILTON-SMITH**.

The Hon. M.D. RANN: The Treasurer has provided the following information regarding FTE Caps:

FTE caps have been established for all general government sector agencies.

The aggregate FTE cap for 30 June 2007 is 74 560.

From 1 July 2007 the Department of Treasury and Finance (DTF) commenced monitoring staff numbers against the caps. This is done through the extraction of data from agency payroll systems. Agencies are required to explain any significant variations between staffing levels and the FTE cap.

The caps are consistent with the level of salaries and wages budgets. Any changes to the salaries and wages budget, for example,

through new initiatives, will result in a corresponding adjustment to the FTE cap. Changes in FTEs between years reflect the timing of all past and present budget and savings initiatives.

INDUSTRY ASSISTANCE LOANS

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: I have been advised that in 2006-07, 59 debts totalling \$4.8 million were written-off in relation to the Industry Investment Attraction Fund (IIAF), a closed program, and 3 totalling \$1.8 million from the Rail Reform Transition Program (RRTP), a closed Commonwealth program now being administered by SAFA.

Some of the companies received their assistance as long ago as 1980.

The IIAF debts were written-off for the following reasons: 41 companies were in liquidation, under administration or deregistered (\$4 million) and 18 companies had no assets or the debts were deemed irrecoverable (\$0.8 million).

The RRTP debts were written-off for the following reasons: 2 companies were in liquidation (\$1.1 million) and 1 company reached a negotiated settlement (\$0.7 million).

In reference to recoveries from companies that had received assistance in the past, I have been advised that SAFA recovered \$3.9 million in 2005-06 and \$10.2 million in 2006-07.

Of the total recoveries of \$14.1 million, \$14 million relates to 82 companies provided with assistance from the IIAF and \$0.1 million from 5 companies provided with assistance from the RRTP.

INVESTMENT ATTRACTION

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: The Department of Trade and Economic Development (DTED) has advised that there are no current guarantees and indemnities provided in respect of the Industry Investment Attraction Fund

As the Minister for Industry and Trade, I have five guarantee and indemnity agreements with Land Management Corporation (LMC) in relation to Balfours Property Holdings; Bresagen Ltd Holdings; former JP Morgan Felixstow Building and the former Motorola Technology Park Building in respect of the Industrial Commercial Premises Scheme.

As the Minister for Industry and Trade, I have an indemnity deed in relation to environmental issues at the former ION North Plympton site with Harley-Davidson/New Castalloy.

PAYMENTS TO CONSULTANTS

In reply to **Mr PISONI**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: The Department of Trade and Economic Development has advised the following:

The variances between financial years reflect the workload as a result of the Commonwealth Government's negotiation agenda in relation to Free Trade Agreements.

The Department has allocated \$330 000 in 2007-08 for the following consultancies:

- \$240 000 for negotiating an increased level of Free Trade Agreements (FTA) with a number of countries, namely Japan, Korea and Chile. Other FTAs under negotiation/consideration include Malaysia, ASEAN, Gulf Cooperation Countries and Indonesia. Funds will be used to obtain independent expert advice to assist the Government in its negotiations with the Commonwealth to protect the best interests of South Australian exporters under these key agreements; and
- \$90 000 for undertaking a mid-term review of the performance of South Australia's export sectors as requested by the Export Council.

PRODUCT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: I have been advised that Product Development programs are delivered by two officers within the Manufacturing and Business Services Division of the Department of Trade and Economic Development (DTED).

The Budget allocation for these programs for 2007-08 is \$98 500. This funding is allocated to:

- The delivery of a series of workshops entitled 'La Salle Matrix Thinking' which introduces companies to a systematic means of identifying product and service opportunities and then evaluating the commercial potential of those opportunities.
- The delivery of five Product Development Case Study seminars. Each seminar focuses upon a key aspect of new product development and encompasses an overview of the topic presented by DTED's officers followed by two company case study presentations.
- Sponsorship of the Industrial Design category in the South Australian Design Awards conducted by the Design Institute of Australia.
- Research into eco-design principles and the commencement of development of an eco-design program applicable to businesses in South Australia.

No funding from the Product Development program budget is allocated to grants paid to companies.

NEW FUNDING FOR WORKFORCE NEEDS

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: I have been advised that as a part of the skills package, Skills for South Australia, Building on Strong Foundations, announced in September 2006, \$98 million is being provided over four years for workforce skills development. The 2006-07 budget provided \$52.11 million over four years of new funding to develop the skills of our workforce in the priority areas of defence, mineral resources, manufacturing and construction.

This package includes new funding for the skills-related commitments made at the last election including:

- the establishment of a Mineral Resources and Heavy Engineering Skills Centre to meet the workforce demands created by a booming mineral resources sector (\$8.58 million over four years);
- funding for an additional 2 600 apprenticeships and traineeships that also align with new growth sectors (\$14.5 million over four years);
- establishment of a branch of Carnegie Mellon University's Software Engineering Institute to develop SA's systems engineering and integration competencies (\$3 million over three years);
- provision of 10 new Trade Schools for the Future to increase young people's skills in areas of industry need (\$24.8 million over four years).

In addition the package included new funding of \$1.23 million over four years for the Bragg Initiative which coordinates the implementation of Thinker-in-Residence, Baroness Susan Greenfield's recommendations to foster a scientifically literate community and stimulate enthusiasm about science in schools.

This package of initiatives will be implemented in close cooperation and partnership with industry to respond to workforce needs in the defence, mineral resources, manufacturing and construction sectors.

NEW FUNDING FOR WORKFORCE NEEDS

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: I have been advised that \$145 000 was spent in 2006-07 developing and implementing a career promotion campaign for the defence, mineral resources, manufacturing and construction industries.

The campaign is designed to promote careers in areas of skills shortage in these sectors. It uses a range of marketing communications tools including events and seminars, public relations, marketing materials, advertising and Internet.

Activities in 2006-07 have included:

- Research and planning for an ongoing campaign.
- Press advertisements to coincide with publication of Year 12 results and complementary promotional material to support student choices in enrolment in university and TAFE.
- A website highlighting the benefits of careers in defence and resources, information on careers in demand, course maps, recruitment consultants and links to other supporting state and federal and industry resources.
- A hotline to connect callers with the range of training service providers, together with appropriate briefing information.
- Promotional materials, displays and activities at the National Careers Expo in May 2007, in collaboration with Department of Further Education, Employment, Science and Technology (DFEEST).

By way of clarification of my comments to the Estimates Committee, commitments to the Air Warfare Destroyer project (AWD) include a total of \$500 000 over 5 years for a targeted campaign aimed at high school leavers and university students to attract them to defence industry related careers and a further \$300 000 to support interstate marketing efforts to attract skilled workers to South Australia.

TRADESTART PROGRAM

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: The Department of Trade and Economic Development (DTED) has advised that according to the Client Relationship Management System records of the Australian Trade Commission, as at the end of Financial Year 2006-07 South Australian Tradestart Export Advisers were providing services to 168 active clients (firms).

GREEN MANUFACTURING AND SMALL BUSINESS

In reply to **Mr PISONI**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: Green Manufacturing is defined as a manufacturing methodology that minimises waste and pollution which is often achieved through product and process design.

The criteria for green manufacturing can be divided into three areas:

- implementation of a systematic approach to environmental measuring and monitoring (eg some form of environmental management system);
- applying good environmental practices into the design of products to minimise environmental impacts throughout the products' entire life cycle (eg minimising the environmental impacts of products in the manufacture, operational and disposal stages);
- implementing process efficiencies and minimising resources used in manufacturing to improve environmental performance and implement cost reductions (cost savings are achieved through the reduction in resource use such as energy).

The Department of Trade and Economic Development (DTED) has engaged with the South Australian Electronics Industry Association (EIA) on green manufacturing. Within its Ten Year Strategic Plan, the EIA has included a strategy to position the South Australian electronics industry as a global leader in green manufacturing. With the growing number of environmentally focused regulations having an influence on the exports of electronic equipment and components (eg European Union's Reduction of Hazardous Substances), the EIA believes that a proactive approach to green manufacturing will not only reduce the risk of losing market share in complying with regulatory requirements but, furthermore, may provide new market and export opportunities.

DTED has provided guidance and support to the EIA to assist in achieving its green manufacturing objectives as outlined in the Ten Year Strategic Plan.

Engagement with business on green manufacturing has been limited to the EIA. According to the EIA, there are 52 EIA members that are manufacturers.

WORKSHOPS

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: I have been advised that the external costs of the 'Will Your Idea Work as a Business' seminars, 'Raising Early Stage Expansion Capital workshops, the Information Memorandum' workshops, and the Building the Management Team workshops as part of the Venture Capital Board (VCB) Equity Ready program, in 2006-07 was \$35 500. This includes the direct costs of the private sector presenters, venue hire and costs of private equity reviews.

The Equity Ready program also includes direct input from Office of the Venture Capital Board (OVCB) staff involved in developing the program, promoting seminars, arranging presenters and registering attendees. OVCB staff are also involved in meeting with companies to review information memoranda, management team capability, the investment opportunity and general equity readiness. This review process includes identification and introduction of potential investors where appropriate. The total estimated staff cost of these activities, including salary and on costs, is around \$120 000 p.a.

It is estimated that the external cost of organising and running the educational workshops in 2007-08 will be in the order of \$40 000, and staff costs will be in the order of \$120 000.

ROYALTIES, EQUALISATION

In reply to **Mr PISONI**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: In calculating the annual GST relativities, the Commonwealth Grants Commission (CGC) takes into account differences in the States' capacities to raise revenues and differences in costs the States incur in providing the same standard of government services. As such, States with lesser revenue raising capacity, or higher costs when compared to the Australian average will be judged as requiring more than the Australian average amount of GST revenue in order to provide similar level services and vice versa.

The decision in the 2007-08 South Australian Budget to reduce payroll tax will not have a significant impact on the amount of GST revenue distributed to South Australia. This rate cut, whilst reducing the actual revenue collection, does not affect the payroll tax base (as would occur with a threshold increase) and therefore, does not impact on South Australia's revenue raising capacity as measured by the CGC. Technically, there will be, however, a very minor negative impact on South Australia's grant share because the importance of payroll tax revenue to State budgets on average will be slightly reduced.

The growth in the mining industry in South Australia is expected to have a more significant effect on South Australia's likely GST revenue grant share in the future. As the State's capacity to collect mining revenue increases, this is likely to have a negative impact on South Australia's GST revenue grant share. The extent of this impact will depend, however, on how South Australia's mining royalty raising capacity compares with the Australian average. For example, growth in the value of mining production in South Australia will be judged relative to Western Australia and Queensland that have both experienced mining booms in recent years.

The State Government is committed to having a competitive tax regime and since 2004-05 has put in place tax relief measures which, when fully implemented by 2010-11, will provide relief worth approximately \$2 billion. This includes over \$300 million in payroll tax relief from measures introduced in the 2007-08 Budget.

ADELAIDE FRINGE FESTIVAL

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised:

The Adelaide Fringe is an incorporated association and, as such, is not bound by the State Government's procurement processes.

In addition to a number of free public events, the Adelaide Fringe produces ticketed events and fits out its own venues for performances and exhibitions by artists. In 2007, three of the 192 venues used for the Fringe's performing and visual arts activities were run by the Fringe itself. The rest were privately-owned and operated and included tents erected in the parklands, arts complexes, cafes, pubs

and nightclubs, studios and galleries, community halls, cinemas, function centres and sporting clubs.

For both the 2006 and 2007 Fringe events, potential contractors were given the opportunity to quote for the provision of the wide range of technical production goods and services required including staging, rigging, lighting, sound, power and fencing.

In the case of lighting and sound requirements alone, for the 2007 event, quotes were received from nine companies, three of which were interstate-based, and six of these companies were used.

Many companies were awarded contracts to provide the full range of goods and services this year, and it is pleasing to note that more Adelaide-based companies were used than in previous years.

It is believed that this reflects the fact that Adelaide production companies are gathering more stock and equipment in order to be more competitive within the context of an annual Fringe.

In addition, all individual artists registered to participate in the Adelaide Fringe are supplied, upon request, with a list of Adelaide production suppliers, but the Fringe does not recommend any one supplier to them.

HISTORY TRUST OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA EMPLOYEES

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I have been advised of the following:

In response to an issue of theft by a History Trust employee that came to light in February 2004, processes at both the National Motor Museum and the SA Maritime Museum (the two museums in the History Trust that charge admission) were reviewed and tightened. However, it should be noted the problem was less with procedures in place, than with a trusted employee who managed to circumvent them. Following an investigation by the anti-corruption branch of SAPOL, the employee in question was dismissed and subsequently pleaded guilty to minor theft charges.

As you would be aware, the Auditor-General was satisfied with the controls in place at the History Trust and as stated in the 2005-06 Auditor-General's report: 'matters arising during the course of the audit were detailed in a management letter to the Chief Executive. The response to the management letter was considered to be satisfactory'. This included the issue of collecting and receipting of moneys.

As stated in the Auditor-General's report, the History Trust seeks to have two people on duty to receive all moneys, issue receipts and count cash wherever possible, but limited staff resources may prevent this from occurring at times. History Trust cannot ensure that there are two people on the reception desk in the museums at all times due to resources only allowing for two guides to be rostered in any shift. However, both guides on duty must ensure accurate receipt of moneys, as well as to ensure the security of the collection on display. This means that, periodically, one guide must leave the desk to patrol the museum. However, there are always two people to count and reconcile the money at the start of the day and to reconcile again at the end of the shift.

The History Trust, Arts SA and the Auditor-General are all aware of this issue.

ROYAL GEOGRAPHICAL SOCIETY OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised:

The provision of staff and administrative support by the State Library to the Royal Geographic Society at no charge ceased on 1 July 2005.

The support provided comprised:

- 18.5 hours per week of staff time to provide customer services;
- 4 hours per month of staff time per month for collection processing;
- information technology hardware, software and staff time to support; and
- administrative support to receipt monies and use photocopying equipment.

The resources that were freed up have been redirected to State Library services.

YALATA POLICE POSITIONS

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE**.

The Hon. J.W. WEATHERILL: The Minister for Police has provided the following information on 19 July 2007:

Prior to 10 August 2006 the establishment staffing at Yalata consisted of one Community Constable Supervisor (a sworn police officer) and two traditional Community Constables.

The position of Officer in Charge, Yalata was permanently filled on the 10 August 2006 by a Brevet Sergeant, taking the establishment at Yalata to two sworn officers and two traditional community constables.

This staffing level remained constant until the Brevet Sergeant was injured at work. He has been off duty and will undergo surgery. As a result the Brevet Sergeant will not be returning to Yalata. South Australia Police Human Resource Management Branch will shortly seek applications to fill the vacant position.

Since the Brevet Sergeant has been off duty the SAPOL staffing at Yalata has remained at one sworn Senior Constable Officer and

two community constables. There has constantly been a SAPOL presence at Yalata and when required, support has been provided by Penong Police Station staff.

A Constable from Ceduna Police is currently relieving in the position of Supervisor while the permanent Senior Constable is on leave.

CHILD PROTECTION SERVICES (APY LANDS)

In reply to **Ms CHAPMAN**.

The Hon. J.W. WEATHERILL: The Coober Pedy Families SA District Centre budget allocation for 2007-08 is \$2.027 million, which will fund services provided by Families SA to children, young people and families, including:

- responding to child protection notifications
- supporting families to provide safe care for their children
- establishing and supporting alternative care placements for children and young people who are unable to remain in the care of their birth family
- managing young people on young offender orders
- providing financial support and financial counselling to families and individuals.

An additional \$185,000 is included in the budget allocation for the Coober Pedy Families SA District Centre from a \$5 million increase in child protection funding in the 2007-08 State budget. The additional funds have been used for salaries and contingencies for an additional two positions, a Supervisor and a Casework Assistant, within the Coober Pedy Families SA District Centre to assist in the ongoing provision of child protection services.

In addition to the above, a further two positions, both Senior Social Workers, will be based on the Anangu Pitjantjatjara Yankunytjatjara Lands (APY Lands) at Amata and Indulkana. These additional workers will be co-located in the schools and will be supporting families to provide safe care for children and young people under the age of 18 years.

Plans are underway to have these positions staffed within the next two months, and consultations with APY communities and other stakeholders have commenced. It is anticipated that approximately \$0.5 million will be reallocated from within Families SA for this APY Lands initiative.

In addition to resources committed by the Department for Families and Communities to reduce sexual abuse of children on the APY Lands, a Police infrastructure package has been developed

which commits an extra four police officers on top of the existing South Australia Police, Department of Education and Children's Services and Department for Families and Communities resources.

The terms of reference of the Children in State Care Inquiry have recently been expanded, to require the Commission to investigate allegations of child sexual abuse on the APY Lands. The expansion of the Commission's terms of reference arose from an agreement between the State and Commonwealth Government. The Commonwealth has provided \$1.6 million for the expanded Inquiry and the State is providing significant support via in kind resources.

- In 2006-07, there were 250 notifications alleging abuse or neglect concerning 172 children residing in Coober Pedy and the APY Lands;
- Of the 250 notifications, 219 notifications related to 150 Aboriginal children;
- 63 of the 219 notifications concerning Aboriginal children were confirmed (28.8 per cent) and related to 44 Aboriginal children; and
- 2 of 63 confirmed notifications related to child sexual abuse (3.2 per cent).
